TEAM LISTS

. Team lists are to be filled out completely with full first names and surnames and forwarded through the appropriate channels by the required date.

All players shall be registered with both Basketball Tasmania and the NWBU Inc at least 24 hours prior to playing. Conditional registration (e.g. subject to clearance or subject to payment of registration fee etc) is not acceptable.

. Players registered after the commencement of the Intertown roster must be noted on the scoresheet as the statistician does not know who is registered after the initial team lists are completed so team lists can be adjusted. Please indicate with a * beside new players name. On back of score sheet DOB and address should be noted.

. Player's first names are to be written on the score sheets at all times, an initial will not be acceptable as there could be more than one J. Smith playing.

GAME CONFIRMATION

. **The visiting Association co-coordinator** is to email or phone the host co-coordinator the Sunday evening or early Monday regarding game scheduling for the next rounds.

Courtesy reply from other Association if emailed.

Results procedure

. Host co-coordinators are to email game results through to Raelene Salter wrsalter@bigpond.com and Jono Bourke jd.bourke@bigpond.com on **Sunday Evening** in the following order – U/18 girls, U/18 boys, U/16 girls, U/16 boys, U/14 girls, U/14 boys results will then be posted on the NWBU website & a report will be written for the Advocate junior sports section.

Finals eligibility

. Players must play at least 40% (rounded up to 6 games) of possible roster games to be eligible for the finals. Byes do not count as games played. *Players are to be suited up*

for the game and recorded on the scoresheet, with the exception of State Training & NITP commitments.

. A player can play 3 games above their age group, if they play 4 games they are ineligible to play in their own age group for the rest of the roster and finals, this also includes U12's going up to U14's. (This will deem U12 players ineligible for the U12 development roster).

Injured Player

. An injured player can be named as one of the team on the score sheet with "injured/sick" written beside their name and in this situation count as one of the 12 players who played in the game. The player must be on the team bench, or if in hospital, "hospital" is then to be indicated on the score sheet.

A member of an Association who by virtue of injury/illness fails to qualify for the finals under this Bylaw may apply in writing to the N.W.B.U. Junior Commission at least 14 days prior to the start of the finals for permission to play in the finals. In considering any application the N.W.B.U. Junior Commission shall have regard only two criteria, viz.

- i) whether the player is a "bona-fide" player of the club, and
- ii) The validity of the injury preventing the player from otherwise qualifying to play.

State Training

- A state player with State Basketball Training commitments or NITCP Camps can be named as one of the team on the scoresheet with "state training" etc written beside their name in the situation count as one of the 12 players who played the game.

Permit players

- Teams are allowed two permit players from within the 0364 telephone district.

Drawn games

. A drawn game in during the season must be played out. An extra 3 minutes is to be played. In finals there can be no drawn games and an extra five minutes will be played if required.

Close results

. When a game finishes and there are three points or less the difference, both coaches and the match manager are to sign the back of the scoresheet to confirm they agree with the result. Article 9 of the FIBA rules details what information and when it can be altered on a scoresheet.

. Unresolved matters are to be referred to the NWU junior commission.

Referee

All Associations must supply a referee for all age groups. They must wear the correct uniform see uniform policy below.

Team Make-up

. Where associations have less than 7 players of an age group present, they can play intertown members from the immediate age group below to make the team up to seven. U14's are not permitted to play U18's.

Participation certificates

. Team players in the U/14 age group only are to receive participation certificates. Winners and runner-up medallions and appropriate team plaques. Grand final referees will also receive medals.

Referees Uniforms

- . Referees Level 0 will wear a Green shirt which will be supplied from the referee's own Association
- . Referees Level 1 & 2 are required to wear an approved uniform top, black and white or plain grey top or with
- . NWBRA member's referees may wear NWBU tops for matches.

Statistician

. All score sheets are to be forwarded to the statistician each week - This is currently Lynn Lowe, 16 George Street Somerset 7322.

Door charges

. Currently set at \$3.00 per person or \$7.00 per family (with common sense for 'family' and discretion given to young spectators. Non-playing officials do not have to pay, {passes will be provided}. Playing officials are required to pay. Non playing refs will receive passes. There will be 6 passes per age group per Association (3 per team)
